The Trinity Share an Intimate Bond

When God said, "*Let us create man in our own image*" (Genesis 1:26) we understand that the Trinity share an intimate bond. Later when Christ came to earth, God the Father spoke again saying, "*This is my Son whom I love, with him I am well pleased.*" (Matthew 3:17) Jesus' love for God the Father is well documented in Gospel literature.

The power of this intimate bond is not only understood in it's presence, but also in it's absence. Perhaps the most difficult words uttered from the lips of Jesus were not to people, but to His father. *"My God, my God. 
